- The rules related to discipline in the college, are obligatory for the students. Principal's decision in this respect will be final.
- Govt. of Maharashtra by Resolution No. TEM/10967620/96 dt. 6.9.1996 has notified "Ragging" as a Cognizable Offence. Students are requested to restrain from indulging in any form of ragging. Legal actions will be taken, if a student is found violating any of the Ragging Provisions.
- Student Should participate in N.S.S. and N.C.C.
- Compulsory Medical Check-up for F.Y. Students.

Above all, affection for the college and a sincere desire for the well being and prosperity of the college will guide the student in his career.

COMPULSORY AND CREDIT COURSES - Mandatory (Compulsory) Credit courses for award of B.A., B.Com., B.Sc., BBA (CA), BCS Degree. In addition to the compulsory credits of 132, the student has to earn additional 8 credits by participating / conducting respective activities.

ATTENDANCE - ■ Student must attend all lectures / practicals / examinations / guest lectures. ■ Strict disciplinary action will be taken against those students who fail to attend the lectures and practicals. n The university rules demand a minimum of 75% attendance, if failing appropriate action as per rules will be taken.

PICNICS / TOURS / ASSOCIATION - ■ No Picnic or study tour will be considered official unless it is previously approved by the Principal. Guardians are requested to see that their wards do not attend such unofficial picnics / tours etc. n No society or association of the students will be started without the prior approval or permission of the Principal.

Admission Rules & Regulations

Online Admission Session 2023-24

BEFORE FILLING ONLINE ADMISSION FORM STUDENTS SHOULD READ THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS FIRST:

1. Only students who are eligible to take admission in FY for UG & PG during this academic year i.e. 2023-24 should fill the online admission form using the link given below "Online Admission Form". The student should get the printout (hard copy) of this form, take the signature of his parents and put his signature at the place provided on the form. Submit the copy duly signed immediately in the office.

AND

2. Students who have Confirm Admission should also fill the Online Anti-Ragging Form by using link given in the College Website. It is compulsory for each and every student. The student should get the printout (hard copy) of this form, take the signature of his parents and put his signature at the place provided on the form. Submit the copy duly signed immediately in the office.

Admission Policy:

- Admissions, not allowed after expiry of 30 days from the opening of the college. Students are advised to take the admission at the earliest.
- Admission must be taken personally. The prescribed form is available on college website. It is to be filled and submitted before the time limit.
- All admissions will be 'Provisional' and subject to confirmation by the Principal /Admission Committee.
- Admissions are at the sole discretion and decision of the Authorities of the College only. All admissions are provisional, to be confirmed by the Principal / Management and the Admissions Committee. All admissions are subject to further approval by the Savitribai Phule Pune University.
- No other person is authorized to grant or to promise or to make any representation regarding admissions. Inquiries regarding admissions may be obtained only from the College Office during college office working hours.
- Admission shall be given on first come first serve basis for BA, B. Sc., BBA- CA, B. Sc- Computer Science as well as on merit for B. Com & M. Sc- Microbiology of each student.
- All particulars in the form and documents in original will be subject to scrutiny before the student is admitted to the course. If the student is not found eligible according to norms and the rules prescribed for admission by the Savitribai Phule Pune University or if the application is incomplete or required documents are not submitted, such candidate will not be admitted to any of the courses.
- Any attempt by any candidate or anyone else on his behalf to influence the admission process directly or indirectly, would be treated as a disqualification for admission

Eligibility:

- Students seeking admission for F.Y.B.A. must have cleared their HSC (Arts, Commerce, Science / or MCVC course with English as their main subject)
- ITI Passed students are eligible for B.A., B.Com.
- Students seeking admission for F.Y.B.Com. must have cleared their HSC (Commerce, Science with English as their main subject)
- Students seeking admission for F.Y.B.Sc. must have cleared their HSC (Science with English as their main subject)
- Students seeking admission for F.Y. BBA-C.A. must have HSC (10+2) from ANY stream with English as passing subject with minimum 40% marks & 35 % for reserve category.
- Students seeking admission for F.Y. BCS most have passed HSC level (10+2) exam in science with compulsory Maths or 3 years Diploma Course after SSC.

Documents to be submitted

Students must bring at the time of the admission the Original and Two attested copies of the following documents; failing which he /she shall not be considered for admission.

- 1. Statement of marks of the qualifying exam (HSC/Degree or equivalent).
- 2. Passing Certificate.
- 3. The Statement of marks of HSC (XIIth) or equivalent examination. If the HSC certificate (XIIth) does not have the date of birth then certified copy the Birth-Certificate.
- 4. A student coming from a College affiliated to the Savitribai Phule Pune University or Maharashtra Higher Secondary Board must produce a Transfer Certificate and School Leaving Certificate from that College/Board and School. A student coming from any other University or Board must produce a Migration Certificate, a Transfer Certificate or School Leaving Certificate from the University/College/Board/School.
- 5. Domicile Certificate (where applicable).
- 6. Two Recent Passport size color photographs.

Reservation Candidates

Students seeking benefit of reservations must produce Original Documents of the Caste Certificate. In the case of such sub-categories among NT, VJNT,SC, ST,OBC, EBC to whom the creamy-layer criteria is applicable, a valid and subsisting certificate from the appropriate authority that the student does not belong to the Creamy Layer should be produced at the time of admission. If the student seeks admission and benefits in categories reserved other than for backward classes, a valid and subsisting certificate from the appropriate authority indicating that the student belongs to such category.

Fees

The Course fees are as per the norms of Savitribai Phule Pune University and the Government of Maharashtra. Notwithstanding anything provided otherwise, the tuition fees and library fees prescribed for the Student shall be subject to following conditions

Students of Maharashtra:

Means a candidate passing S.S.C. or H.S.C. or Both from a recognized institution in the state of Maharashtra. The candidate has to pay the Tuition fees prescribed by the College and State Government.

Students outside Maharashtra:

Means a candidate whose Domicile status is outside Maharashtra and has passed his qualifying examination form a University outside Maharashtra. The tuition fees for the candidates outside the state of Maharashtra will be Double of the tuition fees

NRI/Foreign Students:

Candidates will have to pay Five times the tuition fees

Bhutan Nepal and Sri Lanka:

Candidates will have to pay Three times the tuition fees

Mode of Payment

Admission will be considered as given and completed only after the student has paid the fees.

- The fees must be paid by ONLINE MODE ONLY IN THE LINK PROVIDED on the same day immediately, after completing other formalities.
- All rules of payment of fees and concessions etc. as stated in the prospectus will be applicable
- If any fees are increased during the academic year by the College under any rules, orders or directions given from time to time by the State Government, Pune University, or other authorities, the student will be liable to pay any such increase.

Refund:

If a candidate cancels admission, fees are refunded according to Savitribai Phule Pune University rules. There shall be no refund of fees for cancellation made after 30 days from the date of admission

Grant of Term:

Admission to each term is a fresh one. The decision to grant the term depends upon the following criteria.

- Attendance of lectures
- Attendance of Practicals
- Performance in term-end exams
- General behaviour of the student inside and outside of the class room.
- Full payment of fees due.

Anti - Ragging Act, 1999

The Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1999. Act of Maharashtra Legislature received the assent of The Governor on 15th May, 1999 and was published in the Maharashtra Government Gazette, Extraordinary, part VIII, dated 15th May, 1999.

- **S.3 Prohibition of Ragging:** Ragging within or outside any educational institution is prohibited.
- **S.4 Penalty for Ragging:** Whoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets or propagates ragging within or outside any educational institution shall, on conviction, be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years and shall be liable to a fine which may extend to ten thousand rupees.
- **S.5 Dismissal of student**: Any student convicted of an offence under S.4 penalty for ragging shall be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational in any other educational institution for a period of five years from the date of order of such dismissal.

S.6 Suspension of student:

- Whenever any student or, as the case may be, the parent or guardian, or a teacher of an educational institution complaints, in writing, of ragging to the head of the educational institution, the head of that educational institution shall, without prejudice of the foregoing provisions, within seven days of the receipt of the complaints and if, prima facie, it is found true suspend the student who is accused of the offence and shall, immediately forward the complaint to the police station having jurisdiction over the area in which the educational institution is situated, for further action.
- where, on inquiry by the head of the educational institution, it is proved that there is no substance, prima facie, in the complainant received under subsection (1), he/she shall intimate the fact, in writing to the complaints.

The decision of the head of the educational institution that student has indulged in ragging under subsection (1) shall be final.

Students must keep their terms strictly in accordance with the rules of the University Authorities for grant of terms. Terms shall not be granted in case of students, in accordance, who are defaulter in paying tutorial, tests, fees etc.

Every student of the college must have an Identity Card. He should always wear it around his/her neck in and out of the college and should produce it whenever called upon to do so by the relevant authorities. No student of the college should travel without his/her Identity card. This card shall be produced at the time of University Examination by every candidate.
